# **Health and Safety Updates**

### Mobile Phone Driving Laws

It's illegal to use your phone while driving or riding a motorcycle unless you have hands-free access, such as:

- a bluetooth headset
- voice command
- a dashboard holder

The law still applies to you if you're:

- stopped at traffic lights
- queuing in traffic
- supervising a learner driver

If your engine is running, your phone should be nowhere near your hands or eye line.

#### Hands Free

You are allowed to use a phone if it is **fully hands-free** – you're not allowed to pick it up and operate it even momentarily.

The police still have the power to stop you if they believe you have been distracted by using a mobile phone while driving, even if it's fully hands-free.

#### using a Phone as a Sat-Nav

It is no excuse to say you're simply following the mapping on your hand-held device. The mobile phone law specifically refers to this, stating it is illegal to use a hand-held mobile to follow a map. If you wish to use smartphone navigation or a mapping app, fix the phone to the windscreen or dashboard, so it's in clear view for use while driving, without requiring you to hold it.

#### Penalties

- You can get 6 penalty points and a £200 fine if you use a hand-held phone.
- You can also be taken to court where you can:
  - be banned from driving or riding
  - get a maximum fine of £1,000
     (£2,500 if you're driving a lorry
     or hus)
- If you passed your driving test in the last 2 years, you'll lose your licence.

### Red Rock Policy

It is our Company policy that you should not use any mobile phones whilst driving. You should pull over to the side of the road in an appropriate place before making or receiving any telephones calls.

#### Fatique - Don't Drive Tired!

- Research suggests that almost 20% of accidents on major roads are sleep-related
- Sleep-related accidents are more likely than others to result in a fatality or serious injury
- Peak times for accidents are in the early hours and after lunch
- About 40% of sleep-related accidents involve commercial vehicles
- Men under 30 have the highest risk of falling asleep at the wheel

### Red Rock Policy

- DO NOT DRIVE if tired.
- Always take regular breaks from the vehicle.

#### Other Guidelines to Remember

- It must be emphasised that you must never drive under the influence of alcohol, or drugs, including medicines which may affect your driving.
- Use seat belts at all times and comply with local traffic conditions.
- Always drive within the speed limit and reduce speed where weather conditions required you to.
